Annual Solstice event features the science of the solstice, crafts and telescope viewings

WEST HARTFORD, Conn., December 6, 2011 – The Children's Museum halls will be decked for the season as we gather on Saturday night, December 17, from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, to celebrate the shortest day of the year and the coming gradual increase in daylight hours. Planetarium Director Kristie Mazzoni will lead guests on an exploration of the science behind the year's shortest day in the Travelers Science Dome Planetarium. Afterward we'll celebrate the season with crafts, a bonfire and telescope viewing. In case of snow, the celebration will occur on Sunday, December 18 at the same time.

"Various cultures, from ancient to modern times and around the world, celebrate this event, which signifies the reversal of the gradual lengthening of nights and shortening of days," explained Bob Griesmer, president and CEO of The Children's Museum. "Traditional celebrations for the winter solstice, also called 'The Solar New Year,' include festivals, feasting, singing, dancing and fires in the hearth. It's a special time of year, and we're happy to celebrate it together at The Children's Museum."
