

## Enhance your curriculum with 'Homeschool Science Adventure Days'

WEST HARTFORD, Conn (August 25, 2014) – From natural wonders, space exploration and team work, Home School Science Adventure Days are designed especially for the Connecticut homeschooling community.



Homeschool families can enhance their curricula through engaging programs relating to science and nature exhibits at The New Children's Museum. These programs meet Connecticut State Standards and provide unique, hands-on science instruction, inquiry-based learning activities, and cooperative learning opportunities.

The Fall 2014 series focuses on Natural Wonders in which students explore biology, and botany through encounters with the museum's live animals and nature center resources. During Space and Earth exploration, homeschoolers will investigate the cosmos and planet Earth through planetarium presentations and hands-on inquiry. In Team Science, scholars will work cooperatively to solve physics, engineering, and chemistry challenges using unique museum resources.

Standards-aligned extension activities are designed to encourage learning at home between classes.

This four-month program offered by the Children's Museum Homeschool Association is designed for students in grades K – 6.

Little Scientists is a program is for children aged 2-4 who are not yet ready to take part in the Homeschool classes but still have a desire to discover and explore. The program will meet during regular Homeschool Programming days. Each session will feature hands-on activities for early science exploration.

In addition to 8 weeks of hands-on, cooperative science instruction in three separate tracks, enrollment in the Children's Museum Homeschool Association includes special perks and programming for the whole family. These include a Family Membership to The New Children's Museum, valid through the end of December 2014. Membership includes unlimited access to The New Children's Museum and Roaring Brook Nature Center as well as hundreds of other museums across the country.

Roaring Brook Nature Center's Home School program focuses on the wonders of woodlands, fields, and streams. Each class session will investigate a different environment with hands-on experiences in the out-of-doors utilizing the varied habitats found in close proximity to the Nature Center.

The program is called Wednesdays in the Woods and meets from 1pm to 2:30pm. Session I meets October 8, 15, 22 and Session II on October 29, November 5, 12.
